Actually, he's right, tritium doesn't glow. Neither does radium. The glow comes from a sulfur compound (I want to say lithium sulphide but I think that's not it) which fluoresces when hit by beta particles, which are the primary decay mode of both tritium and the usual radium isotope. Watch dial paint, etc. is a mixture of this sulfur compound and the radioisotope. Random trivia: My grandmother is the only person who has painted watch dials with radium but has not gotten cancer. zw
